London Theatre Trip 2018





In the last week of June a party of 34 pupils and staff headed off to London. Visiting London is a fabulous glimpse of a vastly diverse culture and this

experience is based around three top class west End Shows. From the 30's Hollywood glitz and glamour of 42^{nd} Street to post-revolutionary France with Les Miserables and then finishing with School of Rock, where a failed rock star posing as a supply teacher in an elite fee-paying school, introduces the pupils to the music of Rock legends. The



pupils form a Rock band and win Battle of the Bands! All very different, all brilliantly staged, totally engaging and thoroughly enjoyable.

Our daytime activities included the London Eye, an open top bus tour, the Emirates cable car,



Oxford Street and also time to soak up the Bohemian atmosphere of Covent Garden with its vast array of street artists, stalls and café culture.


Fhuair na sgoilearan cothrom beachdachadh air na
