| Welcome                   | Dr Shaw welcomed Constable Chris Tait from Police Service of Scotland to the meeting.  |  |
| Matters arising           | At the end of the last meeting concerns were raised about high perceived levels of drug misuse in the locality. It was agreed that Dr Shaw would approach Inspector Allan to invite a police representative to attend a PC meeting to address some of the concerns raised. Constable Tait spoke initially about legislation relating to drugs — The Misuse of Drugs Act from 1971 and the more recent Psychoactive Substances Act 2016 which encompasses what we would know as Legal Highs. He then went on to discuss the powers that the police have to search a person over the age of 18 and what limitations they work with. He advised that for anyone under the age of 18 the principle of GIRFEC to be applied and any intervention must be demonstrated to benefit the young person. He proceeded to tell us that when considering whether they are going to initiate a search they must consider the following — have the officer Seen anything that gives them serious concern that the person may be carrying illegal substances; has he / she Heard rumours or conversation that would support the concern? How is the person Acting at the time and is the nature of their Conversation suspicious at all? All this is then put together with any local Knowledge (intelligence) and finally are there any tell-tale odours or Smells in the vicinity. This is all summarised with the acronym SHACKS and has to be worked through in moments when evaluating a situation and if a genuine and reasonable impression is formed that there may be an illegal substance found, a search can be undertaken. Intelligence alone is not sufficient grounds for initiating a search. |  |

|   | He did however emphasise that intelligence is hugely important, and that all information passed to the police is entered into computer systems that can cross reference information and collate it.  We were reminded that anyone can pass on information to the police by ringing 101 or Crimestoppers 0800555111 if they wish to remain anonymous.  Reference was made to an anti-drug initiative that was undertaken in January 2017 at Tain Academy and it was agreed that more information would be found out about the context and outcomes of this project.
